Kennewick Rotary Club, and retired from a 20-year career as a Republican in the United States House of Representatives.

Tara Westover and her six older siblings knew no life other than the one created for them in a modest house at the base of Buck Peak, a rugged mountain in Southeast Idaho. She spent her adolescent years working in her father's junkyard, foraging for sellable metal, and assisting her mother in making tinctures and salves in their cluttered kitchen.

She didn't set foot in a classroom or in a doctor's office during her entire youth, and lacked not only a birth certificate but also a basic understanding of how the world worked outside of her family's home. She did not attend public school due to her father's mistrust, and by the time Tara was old enough, her mother didn't bother with home-schooling either.

Tara, by all accounts, was simply uneducated. Her parents, devout survivalists and fundamentalist Mormons, shielded their children from the truth that could be found outside of their strict beliefs, and spent their days preparing for the end of the world.

Tara spent her childhood in the shadow of a beautiful mountain, and in the shadow of her older brothers who managed to escape their reality and risk everything to pursue their educations. She lived under the watchful eye of her father, who would rather see her

of the world, as opposed to the strict rules of God. Life within the four walls of their home was a paranoid, borderline bipolar existence.

Tara was destined to follow in the footsteps of her put-upon and fearful mother, who pursued a life as a midwife and creator of homemade salves and essential oils, thus feeding into the perceived evil of modern medicine.

This was not who Tara truly was. She craved an education, and to dance and sing with other girls her age. She wanted to know more, to be more, but pursing her thirst for knowledge would be at the expense of her family's love.

Knowing more would make her more powerful than her violent, protective brother Shawn, who greatly affected perso Tara and everyone who dared get in his path. Knowing more would mean questioning everything she's ever known about her future role as a wife, a mother and a midwife, and finding the truth about a world beyond her family and herself.

She decided it was worth it all, and as a new future opened itself to her, her old life slammed the door in her

face

Tara Westover has written a beautifully raw coming-of-age memoir that

outlines a life of contradictions. In it, she shows the unbelievable real life of a family desperately trying to stick to their ideals despite the harm it does to those they are trying to protect. Tara triumphs over physically, mentally and emotionally unstable situations to rise above the limiting expectations and thrust herself into the unknown.

The sacrifices she makes to pursue her dreams and defy her family

are simultaneously tragic and inspiring. She has captured the real emotions and almost surreal internal struggle she must undertake to not only get what she wants but to keep herself safe from those who love her most.

Educated is a deeply moving personal memoir, and an eye-opening story into a life that most people could not survive. It's the story of a personal journey that is worthy of praise and admiration. It is wonderfully written and definitely worth the time it takes to read.
